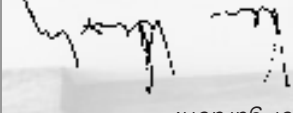
2006 Woollahra Small Sculpture Prize finalists talk informally about their work in the Woollahra Small Sculpture Prize exhibition.

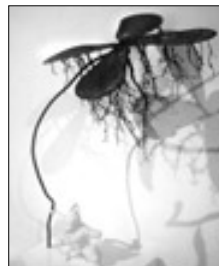

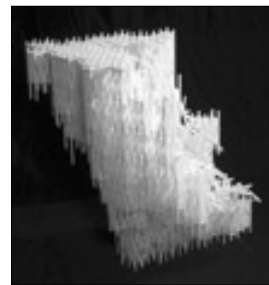

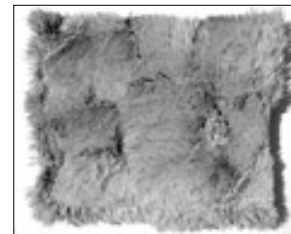
